A LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

This issue of the SCAM will deal with its editorial policy, which remains largely unwritten, but very much in effect. There is a reprint of a joint letter from AMC Chairman Henry Noble and Past Chairmen Gabriel Werba and Charles Fallon on page five. They express the editorial policy of this publication more eloquently than I can. Although many may find it hard to believe, this policy has been tested in the Space Coast Area during the past year.

InterLoc is a national Mensa publication that is sent to all LocSecs, Editors, national SIG coordinators, national Mensa officers and the American Mensa Committee. In the October issue of InterLoc, Linda Kelso (InterLoc Editor) commented on the letter mentioned above. Her ideas also eloquently express your humble editor's policies. Here is her letter:

"Well stated, gentlemen, and I think most Mensans will strongly agree. But a word to the editors. While we can, to whatever degree each of us personally chooses, embrace as peers those who differ in belief, we have a legal and moral responsibility to consider which of these personal beliefs and opinions of members we publish -- render into print for posterity. In the communications field, it is axiomatic that whatever gets printed automatically gains authority. Moreover, our printed materials, from our Bulletin and brochures, right down to our most modest local newsletter, represent Mensa to the public at large. Editors have a responsibility to Mensa and to themselves, personally, to carefully distinguish between that which is simply different or generally unpopular opinion, and that which is just plain emotional bigotry or bias -- and to print the first, if they wish, but eschew the latter.

"An editor's responsibility is to the local group, not the individual member. No matter how scarce the contributions, the editor bears no obligation to print everything received. Further, there is a distinction between editing and censorship. Editing is fact checking, grammar, polishing, condensing, excerpting, and eliminating that which may be inaccurate, libelous or inappropriate. Censoring is just plain refusal to print something because the editor doesn't agree with the writer.

"Finally, the editor must distinguish between that which disagrees with an idea and that which attacks the idea's adherent(s). Reasoned debate about ideas and issues has a welcome place. Attacks, negative comments or emotional bigotry and bias accomplish nothing."

There you are. I couldn't say it any better than Linda. She has put in writing the editorial policy SCAM has followed in the past, and will continue to follow in the future.

A MEMBER SPEAKS by Henry Noble, Gabriel Werba, Charles Fallon

(This a slight departure from our normal format, but the letter that follows was sent to all local groups and reprinted in both the Bulletin and the InterLoc. It's reprinted here to complete the editorial policy statements found in "A Letter From the Editor". Ed.)

Dear Fellow Mensans:

A recent issue of the Mensa Bulletin carried a letter to the Editor that contained long-discredited anti-Semitic material. Earlier, an unofficial Mensa newsletter also carried a letter that was regarded by many readers as having anti-Semitic undertones. A few local group newsletters have carried material, at times, that could be interpreted as being bigoted.

Constitutionally, we cannot legislate against such writings. To attempt to do so would be contrary to the fundamental policies of Mensa. However, we personally deplore such material and we wish to reaffirm the fact that the American Mensa Committee does not condone or encourage its publication. Such writings are antithetical to the basic character of Mensa-- a character that respects the human spirit in all its facets.

The fact that the only criterion for membership eligibility is the ability to score in the upper two percent on a standardized I.Q. test is, in our opinion, Mensa's greatest strength. It insures that we will have the opportunity to encounter a wide variety of opinions, ideas and philosophies, and thus it enriches us all.

Most Mensa members are willing to embrace as peers those who differ in opinion, belief, and cultural, political, ethnic, religious, or national background. But not all. Mensa has always had, and will always have, a very small minority of members who are socially destructive and constantly obnoxious -- members who are bigots, racists, white supremacists, anti-religionists, anti-Semites, and others with a personal urge to sow hate and dissension.

We regard such destructive and bigoted individuals with the scorn and contempt they deserve. At the same time, we are grateful that of all people on this earth, Mensans, overall, are among the most intellectually curious, the most appreciative of differences, and the most tolerant of others.
