

MINI-MINUTES OF THE AMC MEETING, HARTFORD, CONNECTICUT. NOVEMBER 12, 1983

REPORTS: NOBLE: Interviewed on Voice of America in September, 1st Vice-Chairman Amy Shaughnessy... International Board of Directors has appointed David Tebbutt of London as Editor of the International Journal, and Ed Oram of Atlanta as Editor of Mensa World... Encouraged planning for a second Mensa Colloquium. SHAUGNESSY: At the Atlanta RG, along with David Mann and Dick Brasgalla, conducted a workshop for local group leaders. MANN: Has undertaken to familiarize himself with the in-house computer system. FELT: Updated copies of past AMC actions have been distributed to the AMC. RIDER: AML is healthy and running very close to its budget. Rhode Island Mensa enjoyed a successful mini-RG. CRUTCHER: Greenbo RG had attendees from seven states. KUPPER: A regionally sponsored think-tank on local programs for gifted children was held at the Toledo RG. BRASGALLA: Participated in a workshop for Editors and LocSecs at the Peachtreat RG... Gainesville, FL group is again operative. HAWKINS: North Texas Mensa is looking forward to another successful Thanksgiving weekend RG. FROMMER: New group, South Dakota Mensa, has been formed... Will be holding a local officers' workshop at the St. MATHISON: 450 attended Asilomar XIX. MATTSON: Diane Louis RG. Mitchell (San Diego) is organizing a Mensa train for the trip to the 1984 AG. GRACI: 31 RGs already booked for 1984. JOHNSON: 186 active SIGs presently. FISHER: Has established the Monthly Hints & Tips for Editors. SEITELMAN: National office has handled 200 requests totalling over 54,000 items since August lst... 5,000 inquiries were received in the week following the November 6 feature in the Family Weekly Sunday supplement magazine.

Authorized Star Registration Systems International to use the Mensa name in its advertising in exchange for a contribution to MERF and Gulf Coast Mensa. Approved designation of 1984 as "American Mensa's Year of the Gifted Child". Increased MERF budget by \$7,500. Authorized a grant to MERF for the Rita Levine Scholarship Fund, which will match other contributions dollar for dollar. Appointed Helen Kupper as AML's fourth National Representative on the International Board of Directors. Unanimously conferred the Conferred Award on Marvin Grosswirth. Distinguished Service Award and a life membership on Lya Korda.
